The distinguished artists, Luise and Morton Kaish, will share their experience in Sculpture and Painting during their term as Artists-in-Residence at Dartmouth College.






TWELVE TRIBES 1973 Bronze, 18 d.






FIELD OF FLOWERS 1973 Bronze, 27½ x 28½
