**SOUTH HADLEY, Mass.,** March 3—Twenty-six American women artists will be represented in an exhibition April 10 through April 29 at Mount Holyoke College in conjunction with the college's 125th anniversary celebration.

Each of the artists, both painters and sculptors, will show at least two works. The exhibition will celebrate the "coming of age" of women as creative artists, the college announced this week.

It will cover American art from 1880, the date of two paintings by Mary Cassatt, to 1961. The works range in style from late nineteenth century realism to abstract purism.

The artists, besides Miss Cassatt, are Isabel Bishop, Lee Bontecou, Louise Bourgeois, Mary Callery, Rhys Caparn, Elaine de Kooning, Claire Falkenstein, Perle Fine, Helen Frankenthaler, Jane Freilicher, Minna Harkavy and Grace Hartigan.
